These fitting instructions have been created to give you all of the information you need and, if you need any further help, please do not hesitate to contact us.

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Important Safety Information

- Please read these instructions thoroughly and retain for future use.
- All products manufactured and supplied by Bristan are safe provided they are installed, used correctly and receive regular maintenance in accordance with these instructions.
- If you are in any doubt about your ability to install this product safely you must employ the services of an experienced qualified plumber.
- This fitting needs to be installed in accordance with, and meet the requirements of the Water Supply (Water Fittings) Regulations 1999 and Scottish Byelaws 2004.
- Remove all packaging and check the fitting for damage before starting installation.
- **Warning:** Before starting any installation please consider the following: before drilling into walls, check that there are no hidden electrical wires, cables or water supply pipes. This can be checked with the aid of an electronic detector.
- If power tools are used do not forget to:
- Wear eye protection
 Unplug equipment after use
- **Important:** Remember to turn off the mains water supply before connecting to any existing pipe work. Fitting isolating valves to the inlet feeds is recommended for ease of maintenance.
- A Warning: Before installing the new fitting it is essential that you thoroughly flush through the pipework in order to remove any remaining swarf, solder, etc. Failure to carry out this procedure could cause problems or damage to the workings of the fitting.
- Take care when handling the 'flexible connecting pipes', do not bend, twist or crush them. Only tighten the pipes by hand.
- This product must not be modified in any way as this will invalidate the guarantee.

General Information

This product has been tested to the Water Regulations Advisory Scheme (WRAS) and satisfies the requirements of the Water Supply (Water Fittings) Regulations 1999 and current bylaws. For full Installation Requirements & Notes (IRN) please visit www.wras.co.uk/directory.

Designed to comply with BS EN 200 for combination taps to be used within systems designed to BS 6700.

BS 6700 recommends the temperature of stored water should never exceed 65°C. A stored water temperature of 60°C is considered sufficient to meet all normal requirements and will minimise the build up of lime scale in hard water areas.

If the product is installed at low pressure (tank fed), then the minimum distance from the highest installed position of the outlet to the underside of the cold tank should be at least 2 metres to ensure adequate performance.

Note: BRG 3HBF C and BRG 3HBAS C require 3 metres if installed on a low pressure system.

These taps and mixers should be installed in compliance with the Water Regulations. Where the supplies are unbalanced, i.e. Hot water from cylinder tank / cold from the mains, approved check valves must be fitted in the supply pipes.





Wall Mounted Basin Mixer


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

Wall Mounted Bath Filler







Installation Requirements

Flexible Connecting Pipes

Care must be taken when connecting the flexible connection pipes to the household pipework to ensure they do not bend sharply and kink or twist.

See below for recommended ways to fit the flexible connecting pipes.



Important: Failure to follow these guidelines may result in poor performance and damage to the flexible connecting pipes.

Important: Full access must be made available on installation for future maintenance/ servicing purposes.

Installation

3 Hole Basin Mixer/ Bath Filler

1. Unscrew the locking nut from the side bodies.

2. With the backnut, metal and rubber washers fitted to the side body threaded tails, feed the side body through the hole in the basin / bath from underneath.

3. Screw the locking nut onto the valve, ensuring the washer is fitted between the locking nut and basin / bath, onto the treaded tail and tighten backnut underneath onto the bottom of the basin/ bath. The screws on the backnut allow for any uneven surfaces and should be tightened up to the metal washer. Replace the handle, grub screw and the rubber cap.


4. Fit the spout to the basin/ bath tightening the backnut. The screws on the backnut allow for any uneven surfaces and should be tightened up to metal washer.


5. Attach the T- joint assembly and connect to the side bodies (hot on the left, cold on the right when viewed from the front), by using flexi tails supplied.


6. Connect the hot and cold water supplies to the side bodies (hot to the left, cold on the right hand side), fully open both valves, letting the water run for a few minutes to flush the system.

7. Fit the clicker waste (basin mixer only) ensuring the rubber washer is fitted between the basin and the waste. Place the other rubber washer under the basin and secure in place by tightening the backnut. In order to fill the basin, the button in the middle of the waste needs to be pressed down. To release the water, press the button again.

8. Check all joints and connections for leaks.







Installation Cont.

Wall Mounted Basin Mixer and Bath Filler

1. Decide on the final position of the basin mixer/ bath filler. Install suitable battons into the wall cavity if required to support the tap body.

2. Plumb the hot and cold water supply pipes to the required position.

3. Secure mixer body using the screws and wall plugs supplied.

4. Attach the supply pipework to the hot and cold inlets (hot on the left and cold on the right when viewed from the front) ensuring the olive is fitted to the copper pipe work. Tighten the compression nut to secure the pipework and create a water tight seal.

Note: Before finishing the wall surface turn on both water supplies to check for any leaking connections.

5. Push the valve shroud onto the valve and secure by using the shroud locking nut.

6. Finish the wall surface.


Note, it is important that a sufficient amount of the spout connecting tube is left exposed to allow the spout to connect.


7. Attach the spout to the concealing plate using the screws supplied.


8. Push the concealing plate over the valve shrouds ensuring the o-rings on the spout connecting tube have located inside the spout. Tighten the grub screw to secure the spout in place and push fit the rubber cap.

9. Push the handles onto the valve spindles. Tighten the grub screws and push fit the rubber cap.

10. Turn on both water supplies and operate the handle letting the water flow for a few minutes to flush the system.







Maintenance

General Cleaning

Your product has a high quality finish and should be treated with care to preserve the visible surfaces. All surfaces will wear if not cleaned correctly, the only safe way to clean your mixer is to wipe with a soft damp cloth. Stains can be removed using washing up liquid. All bath cleaning powders and liquids will damage the surface of your fitting, even the nonscratch cleaners.

Note: Never use abrasive detergents or disinfectants or those containing alcohol, hydrochloric acid or

Cleaning

Before carrying out any maintenance, turn off both water supplies or close any isolating valves to the tap. Prise out the rubber cap, losen the grub screw using a 2.5mm hexagonal key and remove the handle. Screw the locking nut and remove the valve using the correct size socket. Wash the valve with clean running water and make sure that any debris has been removed.

If necessary replace the valve using parts supplied by Bristan only.

Lightly grease the seal (only use silicone grease), replace the locking nut and handle.

Tighten the grub screw and push fit the rubber cap.



Important: Tighten the valve with the correct size socket and apply appropriate force/torque. Do not overtighten.

Troubleshooting

Symptom	Cause	Remedy	
No flow or low	Partially closed isolation valve.	Open isolation valve.	
flow rate	Instantaneous water heater cycles on and off as flow rate or pressure is too low.	Increase water flow rate or pressure through system to meet required minimum working pressure of tap.	
	Head of water is below the minimum distance required.	Refer to 'Specifications' on page 4.	
•	Hot or cold water being drawn off elsewhere causing pressure changes or instantaneous boiler temperature changes.	Do not use other water outlets when using the taps.	
	Airlock or partial blockage in the supply pipework.	Flush through pipework to ensure removal of debris and any airlocks.	
Water dripping from taps	This is normal for a short time after using the taps.	This is caused by capilary action, the build up of water in the tap body.	
	If water continues to drip, possible build up of debris/ limescale in ceramic disc valves.	Remove valves and clean, refer to 'Maintenance' section on page 11 before removing the valve.	
Taps do not	Closed isolation valve.	Open isolation valve.	
turn on	Water suppliesto the tap turned off.	Turn on both water supplies to the tap.
